

Review of: "Digital Skills and Learning in Tanzania Secondary Schools: Students and Teachers' Influence"

You have one fundamental flaw that you need to look into, namely the confounding meanings of some of the phrases that you wrote. In the title you wrote "students and teachers' influence", which is very different from another phrase you wrote in the body of the article: "digital skills influencing learning". The former means it is the teachers and students who influence something, while the latter means it is the digital skills that influence the learning. Which one do you mean to use?

Your phrase "influencing learning among teachers and students" need clearer elaboration. In what way does it influence learning? Is it in terms of speed, efficiency, effectiveness, fun, or what?

Your literature review needs a few sentences that serve as a summary of your review and relate it to your main objectives.

Your phrase "the study used (n=85) respondents" is not an acceptable style for a research report aimed for a journal.

In your table you wrote excerpts of the interview and suddenly there is a phrase "MS Word" as the sub theme. What do you mean by this? I don't see any phrase in the excerpts that can be coded as "Ms word". Your coding needs a rework.
