

Review of: "Understanding on Social Utopia: West to East"

The essay "Understanding on Social Utopia: West to East" is an attempt to analyze the social utopia that exists between the East with Rabindranath Tagore's philosophy in relation to the West with Rousseau. There are a few points that need to be considered:

- 1. It does not philosophically define the views of both East and West.
- 2. The points of view are very biased a priori to consider a social utopia between East and West.
- 3. According to the title, more philosophical authors need to be listed for a more objective and philosophical analysis.
- 4. Some paragraphs are very confusing: "We could have simply been content to be able to feed ourselves and procreate for the survival of our species... It had just been mentioned that logic barely sees any profit in matters like spirituality even though this assertion is to be argued against."
- 5. "If experience is the path to mental expansion and this experience has been witnessed ... why was the latter part of the previous sentence asserted? Why has it been indicated that we have not learned and driven towards mental excellence?" In this passage, the "previous sentence" referred to couldn't be located. A link appears to be missing between this passage that begins a new paragraph and the previous.
- 6. Was Rousseau's philosophy at the heart of the 1970s Hippie Movement? If so, sources must be quoted.

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
