

Review of: "Improving the Integration of Epidemiological Data Into Human Health Risk Assessment: What Risk Assessors Told Us They Want"

- 1. This review deals with the important issue of health risk assessment; however, the text is full of colloquial statements rare in academic reports (e.g., "risk assessors are widely dissatisfied with the conduct of epidemiology" (P1, p2, L2); "inexcusable" (P1, p2, L7 and 12); difficult to understand (P3, p3, L1-8); including inadequate statements "even worse than the latter," "they do not provide any advice" (P3, p3, L6-7).
- 2. In Table 2, the numbers should be completed with the total number of respondents considered.
- 3. The text is too long and should be scientifically brief and explicit (e.g., P15, p2, L1-5); (P19, p2-3, L1-18).
- 4. I think that the whole manuscript should be written according to academic concepts.

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
