**Abstract:** The procedures and findings are not made evident enough; I would recommend providing more detailed information so the abstract to give a sense of the study's findings. Furthermore, there is a significant difference between the conclusions in the paper and the abstract.

**Background:** I would advise the author to provide additional details regarding the article's study object and to more precisely state the purpose of this paper in the final section.

**Materials and procedures:**

The research method is good . I think the author should have positioned this paragraph before the results. I believe there should be more information about the SHARE study, such as what kind of survey it was. Were there any criteria for inclusion and exclusion? I propose that the writer explain

the results and discussion are quite good, add your opinion to the discussion which is supported by theory
