The article "Determinants of Women Entrepreneurs' Business Performance: Evidence from Micro and Small-Scale Enterprises in Arba Minch Town, Southern Ethiopia" brings an important approach to the research topic.

I suggest that for submission to a scientific journal, the objective and a structure should be included in the introduction. I also recommend that the hypotheses be incorporated immediately after their theoretical support. Hypotheses H2, H4, and H6 could be further explored.

Regarding the methodology, I missed the presentation of the variables used in the study (questions). Discussing qualitative methodology is not necessary in this study.

Was the questionnaire administered in person or digitally? If the adapted questionnaire was applied for the first time in this context, I suggest conducting an exploratory factor analysis.

The results are highly descriptive and lack analysis; for a high-impact journal, it is important to present the results of the collected data and compare them with the specialized literature presented in the theoretical framework.

In the conclusions, it is important to highlight the academic and managerial contributions of this study in greater depth.

I appreciate the opportunity to contribute to the manuscript.
