

Review of: "Civilizational-Historical Approach and the World Order"

This is an important and relevant subject to present, and the author demonstrates a knowledge of some of the leading sociologists of the last century. Today, we are generally very confused about the present world order, and how events that are presently happening impact on nations and their progress. An attempt to illuminate this issue is to be applauded.

However, the article lacks an outline structure and a categorisation of approaches to explain world order. There is some description of ideas but limited discussion, so that a conclusion is not possible or attempted by the author. Many concepts are introduced without definition or explanation (e.g., secular asceticism), which makes this a problem for readers who may not be familiar with these terms. Also, the English needs attention (e.g., racial consciousness and **tolerant -** this latter word should be **tolerance** to make sense in the context used). There are several errors like this that need review.

If the author develops the topic in a more academic way, this could be an article of interest and relevance to an audience. There must be a demonstration of personal reflection and a review of the ideas presented, with indication of how approaches can be developed in line with present world needs for understanding. Examples of approaches in real contexts would be useful to give life to the ideas. This is a start to a worthwhile article, and I hope the author will be interested to develop the content further.
