Reviewer's Comments

General comments

The authors deal with an important refugee issue. Since the start of the Syrian civil war, a large number of refugees have been transiting through Turkey on their way to Europe. Unfortunately, most of them remain stranded in Syria with their children. This study is important because it describes the demographic and clinical characteristics of refugee children using healthcare services in Turkey. The results of this research will be necessary to prepare the care of this vulnerable population. The article is well written, with a good introduction (except for the study justification part), good methodology, good presentation of results, and good discussion. However, there are some areas for improvement before publication.

- 8. The following sentence: "In March 2022, Ministry of Health Director announced that 754,000 Syrian babies had been born in Türkiye since 2011. This has created a considerable burden on the pediatric and maternal health services" does not have a bibliographic reference. Please complete a bibliographic reference.
- 9. The state of the literature concerning the theme developed was not given towards the end of the paper. The authors did not mention clearly the rationale for their research. They are not the first to work on understanding patterns of healthcare utilization for refugee children in Türkiye. What are the limitations or points not addressed in previous work published mainly in Türkiye that justify this study? I suggest to list and synthetize some of the papers presented around the ideas. Given this way, the research gap will easily emerge to justify the need for the current study.
- 10. The objective is being made more complex for no good reason and needs to be simplified. I suggest that the study aims be simplified in this way: "The study aim was to identify demographic and clinical characteristics of refugee children utilizing the healthcare services of Türkiye."
- 11. After the aim statement, it could be nice to complete the section with a statement showing the importance of this study. One (or not more than two) sentences can easily present the importance.

- 15. To show the normality of a distribution, you can use either the Kolmogorov-Smirnov test or the Shapiro-Wilk test, but not both. Taking into account the sample size, which test did the authors actually perform?
- 16. Nowhere in the methodology did the authors mention whether they had pre-tested the questionnaire before using it. If they had, then how?

V. Results

- 18. In the title of all tables, add the study period.
- 19. For each table, add the confidence intervals for each percentage presented.
