

# Review of: "Sentiment Analysis of Opinions about Online Education in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq during COVID-19"

The study addresses a topic of interest in the field of education, as it provides insight into people's feelings about online education during the COVID-19 pandemic, however the following is apparent:

Little theoretical support on sentiment analysis.

In the discussion the findings are repeated and although coincidence with the literature is sought, there is little explanation of the findings.

The objective of the work is not clear, therefore, it is not clear if the appropriate conclusion was reached.

Regarding the fact that the objective is not clear, I mean that I have doubts about whether what is pursued is to analyze the sentiment through opinions about online education, from the evaluative point of view (if the sentiment is good, not so good) or if what is pursued is simply to analyze whether through online opinions it is possible to detect the sentiment of people.

Accordingly, I suggest clearly defining the objective of the study, which will allow a precise discussion and arrive at relevant conclusions.

In summary, the study covers a topic of interest, previous work is addressed and interesting data analysis models are used, but it is considered that the objective of the study should be more precise.
