

Review of: "[Commentary] #BetterPoster: The gateway to accessible science"

#BetterPoster is a very interesting initiative that, starting from the principles of Usability and User Experience (UX), allows you to **share the results of your work** with others, both specialists in the sector and not, in a**simple** and **accessible** way.

Compared to traditional posters or "Wall of Text poster", they provide, at first, the right information to "make people understand" what our research explains **without neglecting its complexity**, in fact the author can give more information by showing tables and graphs placed in the side bars of the poster. In short, with a more innovative layout, both authors and participants can enjoy the conference more, but this seems to have very interesting results also in the field of **disability** and **accessibility**.

The document is very interesting, but unfortunately I have not found in this article all the necessary information on the #BetterPoster initiative that I recommend explaining in the section: "Introduction", also showing the difference with the layout of traditional posters.

I recommend that you also report the studies that show the importance of this new layout. In addition, it also points out the benefits for the participants, such as lower energy consumption in terms of cognitive workload. Specify that there are different #BetterPoster layouts (Original, Presenter, etc.) and where the reader can download them.

In my opinion, a **very interesting idea** that needs to be more structured in this article, so as to include even those unfamiliar with the subject.
