While it is not an investigation, it is a product, the result of educational practice. The abstract needs to be better written; remember that the current context, objectives, methodology, results, and conclusions must be mentioned briefly, clearly, and concisely. The word short communication should be kept from saying.

The following modifications should be considered for the possible publication of the manuscript.

1. The abstract should reflect the novelty of the proposed work.
2. Grammar and spell checker is required.
3. Insert a general methodological figure to improve the understanding of the proposed work.
4. Highlight the novelty of the proposed work. It needs to be added to the entire manuscript.

One of the severe faults is a description of the methodology or methods applied. The plans are presented neither in summary nor in the body of the text. They are advised to consider using case study methods.
