Review of ms "A Review of Prosody, Punctuation, and Dyslexia: Implications for the Use of Speech Technologies"

This manuscript presents a review on the relationships between prosody and dyslexia in dyslexic readers with the aim of suggesting more optimal use of speech technologies in this population.

On the positive side, the topic of the manuscript is very interesting and the manuscript is well written. In the negative side, this review is too shallow and disjointed. Actually, one would need to read most of the cited papers to have the whole picture, as the details were minimal in most cases. The inclusion of a pilot research from the author does not help either. My advice is that the author should start from Square One with a systematic review of the literature, using *preregistered* guidelines for the choice of the papers, or a meta-analysis if there are enough studies for some of the questions. Unfortunately the manuscript stands now, it is too weak for publication in an international journal.

I am very sorry I was not more positive, but I encourage you to do more systematic (empirical, review) research on these interesting research questions.

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
