- 7. Provide a detailed interpretation of the results, discussing their implications and relevance to the research question.
- 8. Compare your findings with those of similar studies. Highlight any differences or similarities and discuss their implications.
- 9. In some pages, it has been written as "Project," but it should be "Paper." Ensure consistency in terminology, notation, and formatting throughout the paper.
- 10. Ensure the conclusion is clear and concise, leaving the reader with a strong understanding of the study's outcomes.
