Clarity of Writing: The paper lacks clarity in its presentation. The language is vague and needs refinement for better comprehension.

Consideration of Agroclimatic Zones: The paper overlooks the influence of diverse agroclimatic zones on agricultural productivity and livestock choices within the selected states. Assessing this factor would enrich the analysis and provide deeper insights into the differences observed.

Neglect of Excess Milk Issue: The problem of excess milk production, a significant issue in agricultural economies, is not adequately discussed. Addressing this aspect would add relevance to the paper's analysis, especially in the context of dairy farming policies.

Absence of Critical Analysis: The manuscript lacks a critical analysis of agricultural policies and issues in the selected states. A more thorough examination of policy effectiveness, implementation challenges, and their implications is necessary for a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.

In summary, the manuscript requires significant revisions to enhance clarity, justify the state comparison, incorporate supporting evidence, consider agroclimatic influences, address pertinent issues such as excess milk production, and provide a critical analysis of policies and issues. These improvements are essential for strengthening the scholarly value and impact of the paper.
