The authors have focused on the needed growth of higher education in Tamil Nadu, one of the fast-growing states in India.

The following are very important issues in higher education in Tamil Nadu:

- 1. Anna University has reviewed all affiliated colleges and found many colleges don't attract even 10% of the sanctioned seats. These colleges have to be closed.
- 2. A large number of engineering graduates don't get proper jobs for want of industry-specific skills and abilities, and they have to take very low-paying jobs in micro and small companies.
- 3. The shortage of qualified and experienced engineering faculty grows at a fast rate.
- 4. The linkage between the colleges and the engineering industry is very low in Tamil Nadu. Only a few colleges offer cooperative/sandwich programs.
- 5. There is no assessment of industrial needs for engineers, their attributes, and attitudes.
- 6. There are very limited training opportunities for engineering faculty members in industry-specific design, prototype development, testing, manufacturing, and maintenance.
- Most of the institutes can't take up consultancy work due to a severe shortage of resources and competent faculty members.
- 8. The gap between current engineering curricula and industrial practices is very large.
- 9. Many colleges don't prepare strategic plans.
- 10. Only a very few faculty members are involved in interdisciplinary research and publication.
- 11. Many colleges don't fund faculty development.
- 12. There is no effort on Institutional Development.
- 13. In 2030, all colleges will have to grant degrees without any affiliation to any state university.
- 14. There is no action plan for implementing the suggestions of the National Education Policy.
- 15. The state needs educational leaders with integrity, ethics, equity, humility, and an outstanding culture to plan for interdisciplinary programs.
- 16. Every reader looks for innovative solutions to overcome the problems faced by higher education institutions and engineering institutions in Tamil Nadu.
