1/ The references need to be grouped by the topic that address. This will make the paper easier to read. Moreover, it will help readers understand what are the different literature strands pertaining to microinsurance.

2/ How were these references selected? The author is advised to use a PRISMA diagram to explain the way the references were chosen.

3/ The author is advised to apply the systematic literature review (SLR) method to methodologically structure the review.

4/ Even though this is a bibliographical paper, could the authors identify the determinants of microinsurance growth?

5/ All acronyms need to be defined before their first use.

6/ In the introduction the author mentions that 170 papers were studied, whereas in the summary and conclusions section the number changes to 180. The two numbers need to be aligned.
