

# Review of: "Prevalence of Buruli Ulcer Among Residents in Jasikan Municipality: A Cross-Sectional Study"

Although study focused on a very important topic from public health point of view, the article is not suitable for the publication, unless a major revision is made on the manuscript. The introduction section did not justify the reason behind the study. Moreover, the manuscript is written very poorly, and unnecessarily described details about Burundi, rather than focusing on the public health impact of the disease.

Moreover, the study sampled data from 56 residents and applied it on whole population to estimate prevalence, which is basically incorrect.

The result became more absurd as in abstract the author mentioned a total of 56 cases were identified, while in methods it was written 56 cases were selected by simple random sampling. While in the next step it has again been mentioned that the study used a census approach, and a structured questionnaire was used to collect data from whole population. Therefore, the material and methods and results must be written in a systematic and presentable manner to enhance its understandability.
