It is an interesting document about a comprehensive research. However, for understanding the context, it should be a good connoisseur of the San Pedro and San Andrés Cholula, Puebla area. For those who don't know the site, it would be important to add the names of the barrios to the maps. If possible, an image of the pre-Hispanic conformation of these neighborhoods could help to understand better the place. It is significant to add that a detonator of the spatial divisions that the author properly points out is the arrival of the University of the Americas-Puebla in 1966, and later, as a result of the change in legislation in 1992 on ejido land tenure, the creation of the Atlixcáyotl Boulevard and the Anillo Periférico as main vehicular highways, as well as the establishment of the Madero University and the Iberoamericana University Campus Puebla. The three aforementioned universities are located in San Andrés Cholula.
