This is a well-written, conceived, and timely review of the field of 'consciousness'. However, there is a burgeoning aspect of the field which the author has overlooked, namely consciousness of the single cell. There are a number of contributors to this concept: Arthur Reber, Frantisek Baluska, William B. Miller, and John S. Torday. Only Torday has provided a mechanistic basis for consciousness of the single cell based on Symbiogenesis and Epigenetic Inheritance, forming the basis for physiology.
