The study is generally well designed and quite relevant in the context of primary health care settings in Ethiopia and other similar situations. However, I find the term "burden" used throughout the text quite misleading since your study focus was just prevalence. Also, the term "Diabetics" sounds derogatory in some sections; simply refer to persons with diabetes.

The measurement of the outcome variable is not explicit. Was this determined from records or primary data from patients?

Participants' recruitment lacks details. How many people were screened? How many excluded? Why? I see in the methods section a report of six people being excluded instead of being reported in the results section.

Generally, there appear to be several grammatical issues that require English language editing for easy reading.
