

# Review of: "From Necro-Politics to Necro-Ecology: framing the current climate environmental politics in the Americas"

This essay has coined a new term “necro-politics” or “necro-ecology” to describe the dangerous social-ecological picture in the Americas, which is originated from the biopolitics of French thinker Foucault. The main advantage of it is its methodological design by connecting the political ecology and the word “death”. In doing so, it can extend or re-politicalize our understanding to the up-to-date situation of the relation between human and nature in this continent. Also, this article has generalized a four-dimension framework to summarize the detailed embodiments of the worsening reality in environmental governance, ecological protection and resources exploitation in this large area. Therefore, it is a very good article in the sense that it has provided with us a more clear or detailed description to the current crises of ecological environmental governance in the Americas.

In my perspective, this article can be further improved by making some revisions or enrichments. On the one hand, many other eco-Marxists such as Foster and O'Connor, have done lot of political economy research to analyze both the dangerous phenomena in ecological environment and the root reason to result in it. On the other hand, in the last part more analysis of the relation among necro-ecology, necro-politics and necro-economy would be helpful for the readers to understand the necessary political strategy regarding how to move out of the multi-crisis, not only in the Americas but also in the whole world.
