- 1. The definition of mental illness used in mental illness might not be comprehensive. Recommend adding "that result in significant distress and impairment in important areas of functioning".
- 2. Recommend updating "The duration can range from weeks to years" as Major Depressive Disorder can be diagnosed if symptoms persist for 2 weeks or more.
- 3. Recommend changing the terms "mentally distressed individual" to individual with mental distress.
- 4. Recommend including all forms of depressive disorders in DSM-5-TR, and changing the terms anxiety disorders to "disorders that are characterized by anxiety" as OCD and PTSD are no longer categorized as anxiety disorders in DSM-5-TR. Recommend updating the term "psychosomatic disorders" to "somatic symptom disorder" to standardize the term as per DSM-5-TR
- 5. Do you have a more recent data on the National Housing and Population Census? It is year 2023, and the data from year 2007 (15 years ago) was cited.
- 6. Is it a cross-sectional study? I am a bit confused reading about the follow-up data collection time in the exclusion criteria. A more thorough explanation can be helpful.
- 7. Is there any rationale to run the binary logistic regression first before running the multivariate binary logistic regression?
- 8. They are 76 participants of age 20-24 who are studying in high school. It will be helpful if the high school population is explained better in the article, and age 20-24 is not considered as adolescent.
- 9. It will be helpful if the SRQ-20 results and bar graph are reported as per the proposed cutoff. The values seem to be different there, kindly check if there's any typo.
- 10. Have all the assumptions for the statistical analysis met? Is dummy variable coded?
- 11. Some of the points in discussion are very loosely organized. It will be very helpful for readers if the points can be reorganized.

Overall, this is an interesting study and I look forward to read more papers from the author.
