The article "Examining Sustainable Survival Tactics for Small-Scale Bakeries: A Case Study in Lagos State" is original and interesting. The ban on importing a fundamental raw material such as wheat for the production of bread is critial for entrepreneurs in the sector. Therefore, its approach allows us to problematize the situation, to know how bakers have adapted and what changes they had to apply to stay in the market. However, it would be ideal to provide a broader framework on the government's reasons for applying this prohibition as it allows for greater understanding of the issue.

On the other hand, it is believed necessary to incorporate a materials and methods section detailing how and when the primary data were obtained, what were the criteria used to determine the size of the sample, and how it is composed.

In turn, the focus and scope of the research and the methods used to analyze the data must be indicated. These questions are fundamental to support the research and the results presented. In relation to this, the use of the chi square tests and the variables used for each one, together with their hypotheses, should be specified in the methodology section. The presentation of calculations in the results section is not considered appropriate.

It is not clear to what time period the results obtained correspond.

Another suggestion is to briefly describe the study area. The relevance of the results is related to the weight that the activity has for Lagos State. However, despite citing the contribution that small businesses make to economic growth, their representativeness in the study area was not mentioned. These are aspects that allow the reader to understand the scope and relevance of the research in the chosen space.
