Behaviour Change Intervention Ontology (BCIO)

Definition: A behavioural opportunity that involves time and parts of the environmental system that do not involve people or organisations.

Informal definition: Characteristics of a person's physical (rather than social) environment that are needed for a behaviour or to facilitate it.

Comment: A 'behavioural opportunity' is a feature of the environmental system. While the class 'environmental system' is about what is found in an environment, the behavioural opportunity is a feature of the environment which interacts with the person and enables or prevents a behaviour.

Definitions also often require elaboration to make it clear how they should be used and what they include. In those cases we include a comment.
