

Review of: "The use of tele-education in medicine, during and beyond the COVID-19 pandemic: A commentary"

This is a well written manuscript that provides a general glimpse of several applications of telemedicine during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, there might be some points that need improvement:

- Some of the stated applications were already a standard in some hospitals, such as online multidisciplinary meetings to discuss complex cases, virtual interviews, or teleconsultations. It would be interesting to analyze how the impact of the pandemic on an already existing practice.
- Despite all the renowned advantages of telemedicine, the lack of face to face sessions come with a series of drawbacks which have fueled a rising complaint. I advise to explore also the negative impact of tele-education.
- The reason for this manuscript is not well motivated. It should be stated better to give a sense of purpose and a scientific weight to the paper
