This article presents the results of a national survey on Risk Factors and Predictors of Severe Acute Malnutrition Among 6-59 Months Children in Lumbini Province, Nepal. The size of the sample analysed makes these results interesting, even if the author could have had more.

The findings are consistent with data from other Asian countries. The results are of great interest because of the data on the highlighted risk factors associated with severe acute malnutrition in children aged between 6 and 59 months in the province of Lumbini. These are mainly the child's age and the mother's age at delivery.

The statistical analysis is relevant.

The discussion is well conducted. The writing is of high quality. The bibliography is exhaustive.
