The direction and objectives of this study are in line with the needs of contemporary obstetrics, and the following are my suggestions:

1. The important role of umbilical cord itself and the advantages of delayed cord clamping can be described in the introduction section.
2. Introduction: The birth of the fetus belongs to the second stage of labor. This section describes it as the third stage of labor; Premature is less than 37 weeks of the fetus, needless to say; Delayed cord clamping time was defined as at least 30 s after fetal delivery. Some of the definitions in this article can be supplemented.
3. Multiple indicators in Table 2 are statistically significant and could be further explained. The age at birth, 1 month and 4 months after birth were studied throughout the study, and the reason for the selection of 4 months was not stated.
4. References cited throughout the article suggest the use of the latest data.
5. The chart in this article is not concise and clear.
