Review Comments

General

- 1. In your abstract, you did not make it clear that the 100 criminal activity records were from the Newspaper.
- 2. In the Bibliographical Reference (10) dimensions for CPTED (Natural Surveillance, Access control, Territoriality and maintenance) is not new; what exactly do you add with you study? You probably need additional categories that sprang up from this study.

Introduction

- Authors should right from onset talk about Public Spaces and not city identity.
- 2. Is the ground-breaking work of Jane Jacobs known amongst all? I think you need citation here. Unless you assume that it has been covered by Bratinghams's assertion.
- 3. At the tail end of the introduction, kindly provide the structure of the article.

Background

- 1. You cite names (Jeffery) as if readers are already acquainted. Kindly say for instance Trump, the former US president.
- 2. Citing format changed while commenting on Natural Access Control; Do harmonise.

Methodology

- You did not choose whether it is qualitative or quantitative approach. I think your approach is qualitative analysis with content analysis of the 100 case studies as a strategy from the newspaper. Therefore, you need literatures to support this choice, Say: Imoniana, Joshua O., Janette Brunstein, and Silvia Casa Nova. 2022.
