The study was clearly structured, but had some sections that I found lacking some details, or even missing sections altogether. I was surprised that the paper missed two main sections which were the Results section and the Conclusion section. If the author has the intention to publish, I think adding these sections would be vital. I really liked how the Methods and Analysis section was broken down, but the Study Duration and Period has to illustrate specific time periods for each activity. Additionally, it would be better to explain the rationale behind the Inclusion and Exclusion criteria (why some individual were excluded? how would that affect the results?). I also think the limitations of the study need more elaboration. Moreover, the auther needs to explain how the findings would help healthcare decision makers come up with policies to improve the current situation.
