

Review of: "Analyzing Policy to Address Infant Mortality in High-Risk Populations"

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Overall, this topic is interesting since it addresses the issue of infant mortality in the United States, a developed country. The author's title makes reference to high-risk populations. However, we could not find a characterization of the high-risk population mentioned in either the methodology or the outcomes review. So we believe it is critical to explain who the high-risk group is and whether there is any variation in infant mortality rates and strategies. Or is the genuine concern being addressed regarding the rate of death and policies in the general population of the United States? Is it possible to express disparity statistics based on urban and rural (suburban) area categories when responding to goal 1?

In answering objective 2, we believe it would be more interesting if references were drawn from multiple sources. Even if occurrences are rare, I believe there are sources that can explain socioeconomic factors in wealthy countries like the United States. You can look through the data for factors from different countries in the United States that may be linked to infant mortality instances; they may be related. This explains the policy realities in the United States concerning these aspects. I think this will be intriguing.
