- Map and study locations: Consider including a map of the study area and the specific locations where data was collected.
- Plant species identification: The Methodology section should explicitly mention the sources used for identifying plant species.
- Local name accuracy: Identifying plants solely based on local names is problematic, as multiple species can share the same common name in different regions. To ensure accuracy, ethnobotanical studies should rely on in-person visits, interviews, and plant collection for reliable identification.
