- 5. I would have loved to see a discussion on quantitative research on the study with statistical evidence, e.g., on: gender vs. suicide; failed relationships vs. suicide; poverty vs. suicide; Covid-19 pandemic vs. suicide; psychological disturbance vs. suicide, etc...
- 6. How is the suicide reporting and the standards in the rest of the world, on top of the WHO reporting guidelines indicated in the paper (developed countries, developing countries vs. Sub-Saharan Africa)?
