

Review of: "A Value-Driven Future Approach to Precision Medicine for Health Sustainability in New Zealand: A Perspective"

This is actually a very introductory paper on precision medicine. In that point of view, it is well organized.

On the other hand, at the very beginning, I could hardly organize my reading progression. It is hard to follow the flow of the content. Main reason on this is, less is mentioned about the status in New Zealand. I expect a strict mention or a comparison per each part for New Zealand.

In some paragraphs, there are missing citations. The author should re-read and add those citations where missing (i.e. Page 11, two consecutive paragraphs after the bulleted list).

One more thing is about some abbreviations. For example, in Page 3, paragraph 3: it is not SPE-CT, it should be SPECT. Moreover, it is not Single Positron Emission Tomography, it is Single Positron Emission Computed Tomography. This should be corrected.

Finally, in Part 10. Future Prospects, there is a sub-chapter (i) Role of Pharmacogenetics and Pharmacogenomics in Resolving the Individual Variables. But there is no (ii). Is it missing? Or if does not exist, why is there (i)?

To sum up, this article may be a very valuable work for the overall introduction of precision medicine and the status in New Zealand if the author completes those minor revisions.

I request those minor revisions from the author and recommend to re-assess the article afterwards.
