The results delineate differences between standard and everyday English, showcasing language evolution based on various factors. While the objectives, bibliography, and previous studies are commendable, minor revisions in grammar, spelling, and punctuation are suggested for an enhanced outcome. Additionally, the recommendation to relate findings to the context of language diversity in Nigeria and provide detailed data analysis, especially on teacher preparation for explaining language variations, offers valuable guidance for strengthening the article.

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
