The authors presents a rare case of incomplete spinal cord injury due to unilateral spinal cord ischemia, secondary to atherosclerosis and a thrombus in the ascending aorta.

This is a well written article with a comprehensive radiological evaluation.

My only comments is to ask for a long term follow-up.

It would be interesting to follow this patient with an MRI to see whether any change with the spinal lesion occur? Perhaps repeating the CT angio to see whether canalization of the vertebral thrombus has occurred?
