The paper's topic is interesting, and it gives new information about the consequences the COVID-19 pandemics caused in the educational systems, specially in the virtual ones. In this sense, the approach is good, and the actionable suggestions are a strong point.

Conversely, the paper has some weaknesses to be considered. Firstly, the COVID-19 topic might be a bit outdated at this moment. Not as a general topic, but concerning the analyses about those effects, and some questions that seem key in the paper, but the last years' literature has already been taken into account.

Furthermore, some empirical material would enhance the quality and validity of the manuscript. Additionally, a revision about those pandemics' effects in the current moment, would be a key improvement in order to reinforce the timeliness of the paper.

Summing up, as a theoretical or better, as an essay, it is not a bad work, but following the quality guidelines of whatever academic journal, it is still improvable.
