The objectives are clear, though objective two might deserve a more in-depth discussion. However, the body of the article includes elements that comply with the proposed scheme.

Regarding the methodology employed, it is interesting to note the magnitude of work and dedication required to obtain 5000 women entrepreneurs' responses, which is very significant to validate the results of this research. The survey is well structured, concise, and conducive to the information required to assess the participant's responses.
