Furthermore, the section «Current constraints and future directions for collaborative intelligence» may perhaps slightly limit the scope a bit too much?

In combination with crowdsourcing through social media, 'wisdom of crowd' may perhaps be released for both gathering data and analysing them, creating new insight into patterns and mechanism in the market or society, otherwise hidden from view.
