The title of the paper should indicate more specifically that the paper discusses the diseases caused by microorganisms.

Later in the text, it becomes clear which diseases are discussed; however, this is not indicated in the title of the paper.

Perhaps the term "communicable" (Exploring the Factors Aggravating Communicable Disease Transmission in Healthcare Environments: Strategies for Mitigation) should be considered.

After the Introduction, the Methods should be stated: how the authors obtained the data. As no other research instruments were used, the description of how the literature/sources was used should be provided.

The Methods should, logically, be followed by the Goal. It should be stated here what the reason was for writing the paper (perhaps: Show the complexity of the problem of infections that are transmitted in healthcare environments and the implementation of preventive measures).

The very text of the article is well written and describes the problem of what we call hospital infections in a broader sense. In my view, the focus of this paper was on hospital workplace infections.

The authors managed to present a very complex problem in a relatively simple and readable manner.

Although there are no research data, I believe that the paper is worth publishing after the requested corrections are made.

I am willing to review the article again after corrections.
