Personal and societal alienation is the author's central concern (especially among Marxist philosophers). The article's insights are not particularly novel, but they are certainly relevant.

In general, the article fills no non-scientific gap (many have written about alienation under different forms). The conclusion of the article is consistent with the evidence and arguments presented, as well as with the article's aim. Additionally, the references are appropriate, and the author draws her ideas from fundamental sources. The title of the work corresponds to its content, and I do not believe that any additions or alterations are necessary. The author employs language that is easily understood by the target audience, and the summary is appropriate to the content, which is well-organized. Stylewise, the author is characterised by clarity and concision.
