

Review of: "Cruises Italian Tourism: Scenarios and Trends After Global Pandemic — The MSC Case"

The article carries relevance in the field of tourism, as the authors endeavor to highlight the effects of the post-COVID situation on cruise travel, transitioning from the global to the national level. However, several suggestions can be considered:

- 1) In the abstract, the aim and the methodology employed for the realization of the study should be clearly specified, facilitating the transition of the article from a professional to a scholarly level. Additionally, the abstract should incorporate some key findings of the study.
- 2) Keywords may be reduced to a maximum of six, emphasizing the most significant and meaningful for the study.
- 3) Throughout the text, ensure the evident connection between textual analysis and the infographic, avoiding any disjoint between the text and the graphic. It is suggested to provide an expanded source in the graphs or tables rather than a citation form.
- 4) It is noted that most of the infographics are considered as secondary sources, not primary (created by the authors themselves). Additionally, not all citations using infographics need to be visualized, minimizing the diversity of graphics taken from secondary resources (other reports, studies).
- 5) Examine the use of symbols "+" and "-" in text references, and suggest other forms of expression (eg., less, more, over, etc.).
- 6) The conclusions of this study need to be reorganized, derived through the analysis of the data and the methodology employed, to reflect upon the primary purpose of this research. By focusing on the analysis of the acquired data, the authors have to draw specific conclusions directly related to the aims and objectives of their study.
