In my opinion, some small changes and integration may improve the quality of the text and increase the readability.

1. some more references may help to better understand the theoretical context. With reference to the different forms of marginality the PROFECY – Processes, Features, and Cycles of Inner Peripheries in Europe final report made an extended review of all the different manners of being peripheral and considers also those territories that may be an enclave of low accessibility surrounded by very accessible areas, as well as relational proximity.
2. The paragraph "Low development clusters – intersecting marginalities" is more a list of the different territories than a paragraph of discussion about the result. I suggest adding a small paragraph of the discussion before the "revisiting intersetting margins" also introducing some case studies observed at a more detailed scale.
3. there are some typos that need to be fixed.
