

Review of: "Mycetoma in Animals a Review of Cases Reported From 1925-2022; Epidemiology and Management Strategies"

My recommendation for this paper is: Major Review.

The article is interesting; it addresses a topic that has been barely studied in the context of veterinary medicine.

Good research work has been done on several species. However, the article itself is poorly written, with many inconsistencies in spelling, grammar, and punctuation.

The nomenclature of fungal and bacterial species and genera is sometimes wrong (names in lower case, not in italics) and very inconsistent. There are also often missing spaces between words and punctuation. The article looks sloppy.

Regarding the biographical references, they are not correctly marked; they must be placed with a comma between each reference. Example: [93, 94] and not [93] [94].

Given the extension of the work, it would be interesting to include figures (with authorization from the original authors) of lesions associated with these infections.

Table 1 reflects this sloppiness throughout the article quite well. For example, in the "Treatment" column, sometimes it starts with an upper- or lower-case letter; other times, it uses a "+" or "." in the middle of sentences, commas at the end of the sentence with nothing written in front of it...

Therefore, I recommend carrying out a thorough review of the article in relation to these mentioned contents and, after these changes, having it reviewed again by reviewers for a better understanding of the work so that the information can be appreciated.
