The publication would undoubtedly benefit if the authors clarified the review methodology and the research group. Moreover, the text uses two terms: tele-education and tele-medicine, which are completely different issues, which may cause some confusion for the reader. I would also suggest a little more analysis regarding both the positive and negative aspects of distance education in medical sciences.
