The challenge of health care decentralization in Pakistan is a very interesting research opportunity for analyzing the strengths and weaknesses, and for sharing the whole process experience. As limitations are related to one province's public health, maybe a few specific indicators should be posted in context as examples of the health system before and after the amendment. Both situational analysis and strategic planning are required to implement decentralization in the field, and showing the successful and failure results becomes learning experiences.

This type of political, technical, financial, and professional reform has many points of view to take into account for building capacities and overcoming the process. And that is the cornerstone and the great value of this research, I think.

I have some grammar difficulties with understanding a few sentences without a verb and/or subject, or if the reference is cited at the end or the beginning. APA style allows different ways of citing in the text, not only placing the author and the date inside the parentheses, but the date alone while the author remains outside. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph of the "Health System of Pakistan" subtitle, there is a comparison between health facilities, but not a clear relation with any sector.
