**Introduction:**

I have a very big doubt about the intro because most of the reviewed studies are not really connected with the aims of the review (contributing to decision-making in this regard, especially in the region of Latin America and the Caribbean). It's not very academic to use the central part of research to justify the whole research.

**Methods:**

The definition of the PRISMA and PICO methodologies is well done. I don't know why the author hasn't done a flowchart. Maybe the combination of terms for databases can be improved.

**Results:**

In the Results part, when you conduct a systematic review, it's normal to include references to reviewed studies.

**Discussion:**

The discussion needs a formal review; there are several formal mistakes, especially with references. I suggest a section on limitations in this block.

Conclusions have got common information, not exactly about the review.
