Thank you for the opportunity to review this interesting article. The topic related to the aspects that support the performance of women entrepreneurs is of interest to the business environment and concerns researchers at the international level.

In this context, some proposals sent to the authors could be constructive.

In order to support the relevance of the research results on a larger scale, the authors should explain why they consider that Arba Minch Town is representative of Southern Ethiopia. An international reference would be interesting here. The introductory section could be made in a more homogeneous way; the aspects related to the objectives of the study and research hypothesis could be introduced in the text without a delimitation in the form of paragraphs. In the introductory section, the gap in the literature that the study aims to cover is very well identified; perhaps it would be useful to refer to the research methodology, the usefulness of the research results, and perspectives regarding the continuity of the research. A final paragraph in the introduction could be allocated to highlight the structure of the article.

Considering the importance of the studies carried out previously in this field at the national and international level, it could be important to introduce/use the literature review section in order to substantiate the determinants for "Women Entrepreneurs' Business Performance" in the second chapter.

Probably, the section dedicated to the research methodology does not necessarily require the identification of distinct subchapters for the aspects related to the data source, data collection, and so on. These could be presented in a unitary way and delimited only by paragraphs at the level of the article.

It would be interesting to compare the results of the current research with the other studies carried out in the field (as they are presented as a literature review). A reference to the usefulness of the research results for the scientific environment and for the business environment would be important to make in this section.

To the extent that the authors will succeed in introducing these references in the content of the article, the contribution will be positive in terms of the sustainability of the article and the increase in the visibility of the research results.
