For example, Catholic Christians tend (overall) to be quite more focused on "character development" in "Moral Theology" than are Protestants (especially Evangelicals). They may have much to offer for what you are trying to say, yet "sola Scriptura" is not their lens. I would like to see what, exactly, sola Scriptura accomplishes in forming a distinctive Christian character. What, for example, would be different about a "sola Scriptura" Christian from other Christians who are focused on Christian character?
