The paper's subject matter is very important and highly relevant however it seems more like an outline rather than a fully developed paper. In addition, as a non-expert in law and legal studies, it would be nice to have some simple definition in the paper about terminology such as normative model of the human. Also the paper begins with a quote from Nobel laureate D. Kahneman and his argument that nothing seen and observed is neutral, but does not follow through well into the paper. I believe the paper has great potential to be expanded and improved with a vigorous discussion on sex and gender concepts (which is absent now) and some concrete examples of women and members of LGBTI+ community being treated unfairly despite seemingly 'neutral' laws.
