Visuals:

The inclusion of better-quality images will significantly enhance the manuscript's visual appeal and aid in conveying the discussed concepts.



Academic Sources:

The manuscript should incorporate clearly stated academic sources, including data, to strengthen the scholarly foundation of the research.

Language and Format:

The written format and English language need improvement for clarity and academic rigor.
