

## Review of: "Consequences of Neglecting Epidemiology by Global Polio Eradication Initiative"

The preprint focuses on the difficulty in achieving polio eradication due to the neglect of epidemiological information. The article has paid attention to a subject of global interest. However, the topic seems to be fault-finding in it's couching. I suggest that it be recast to be more acceptable.

The authors pointed out something significant in relation to the rule of ethics by asserting that the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) Trivialized issues of ethical concern to accommodate personal bias in the course of treating the disease. This is commendable.

Notwithstanding, the flow of the article should be reviewed by the authors to enhance better understanding by readers who are not experts in the field. Besides, the article appears more like a short communication in structure and tone. Consequently, it could be edited to be shorter with lesser number of references. A clear aim as the last paragraph of the introduction will be commendable.

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
